seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had done. And he blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it, because in it he had rested from all his work which he had created and made. From the moment this blessing was linked with rest from labor, the seventh day has had a double task in the history of God's world: the giving of worship to God and the granting of rest to the tired body and mind.... It is not enough for the human heart to devote the whole day or even six days of the week to binding sheaves: for it to be fully satisfied there must be a possibility, either in the evening or at the end of the toilsome week, for him to offer his sheaves to God. And so work for six days always prepares for the seventh day of the Lord. **Holy days are the voice of one crying in the wilderness:** make straight the way of the Lord (Mk 1:3). They remind us to pay homage to God, the Father of all creation, of life, and of grace; to tear ourselves away from matter, to free ourselves from its powerful influence, to realize that it is not creation that governs man but man creation, to remember the service of God, which is the most wonderful and fitting thing we can do, to come to him through our own sanctification, and to become like God. All this is the special task of the feast day.

All these tasks have to be put within man's reach by a day that is free from ordinary, everyday work.... The fulfillment of one's duties toward God and the fulfillment of the needs of the mind and the heart are the main aims of freedom from work, a freedom that should do good to both soul and body. For the rest on Sunday or a feast day does not mean unproductive idleness but is "rest from labor, consecrated by religion. Repose united with religious observance disposes man to forget for a while the business of this daily life, and to turn his thought to heavenly things and to the worship which he so strictly owes to the eternal Deity" (Pope Leo XIII). Sundays and holy days are meant to remind us that, in addition to temporal work, there are other labors in the vineyard of our own soul. —BLESSED STEFAN WYSZYŃSKI

¡Bienvenidos a junio! Este mes está dedicado al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. El Corazón de Jesús; Símbolo de amor. ¿Pero por qué Su Corazón?

Porque en todos los idiomas, en todas las épocas, el corazón es considerado el símbolo natural del amor y del afecto. ¿Qué símbolo más natural y expresivo hay, entonces, del amor excesivo de Jesús que su Sagrado Corazón?


La devoción general al Sagrado Corazón, lugar de nacimiento de la Iglesia y fuente del Amor, fue popular en los monasterios benedictinos y cistercienses, especialmente en respuesta a la devoción de Santa Gertrudis la Grande (n. 1256), pero las devociones específicas se hicieron aún más Se popularizó cuando Santa Margarita María Alacoque (1647-1690), una monja de la Visitación, tuvo una revelación personal que involucraba una serie de visiones de Cristo mientras oraba ante el Santísimo Sacramento. Ella escribió: "El me reveló las maravillas de su Amor y los secretos inexplicables de su Sagrado Corazón". Cristo le enfatizó su amor y su herida causada por la indiferencia del hombre hacia este amor. Prometió que, en respuesta a quienes se consagran y reparan a Su Sagrado Corazón:

1. Él les dará todas las gracias necesarias en su estado de vida.
2. Él establecerá la paz en sus hogares.
3. Él los consolará en todas sus aflicciones.
4. Él será su refugio seguro durante la vida y, sobre todo, en la muerte.
5. Él otorgará abundantes bendiciones a todas sus empresas.
6. Los pecadores encontrarán en Su Corazón la fuente y el océano infinito de la misericordia.
7. Las almas tibias se volverán fervientes.
8. Las almas fervientes rápidamente alcanzarán la gran perfección.
9. Bendecirá todo lugar en el que se exponga y honre una imagen de Su Corazón.
10. Dará a los sacerdotes el don de tocar los corazones más endurecidos.
11. Aquellos que promuevan esta devoción tendrán sus nombres escritos en Su Corazón.
12. En la excesiva misericordia de su Corazón, su amor todopoderoso concederá a todos los que comulguen los primeros viernes de nueve meses consecutivos la gracia de la perseverancia final; no morirán en su desgracia, ni sin recibir sus sacramentos. Su divino Corazón será su refugio seguro en este último momento.

Welcome to June! This month is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Heart of Jesus; Symbol of Love. But why His Heart? Because in every language, in every age, the heart is regarded as the natural symbol of love and affection. What more natural and expressive symbol is there, then, of the excessive love of Jesus than His Sacred Heart?

General devotion to the Sacred Heart, the birthplace of the Church and the font of Love, were popular in Benedictine and Cistercian monasteries, especially in response to the devotion of St. Gertrude the Great (b. 1256), but specific devotions became even more popularized when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690), a Visitation nun, had a personal revelation involving a series of visions of Christ as she prayed before the Blessed Sacrament. She wrote, "He disclosed to me the marvels of his Love and the inexplicable secrets of his Sacred Heart." Christ emphasized to her His love and His woundedness caused by Man's indifference to this love. He promised that, in response to those who consecrate themselves and make reparations to His Sacred Heart:

1. He will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. He will establish peace in their homes.
3. He will comfort them in all their afflictions.
4. He will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
5. He will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
6. Sinners will find in His Heart the source & infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
9. He will bless every place in which an image of His Heart is exposed and honored.
10. He will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in His Heart.
12. In the excessive mercy of His Heart, His all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in His disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. His divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

Note: There are devotions attached to these promises which are too long to list here; however, those devotions will be published in next Sunday's bulletin.
